Dear Dr. Koo:

On the basis of the information provided by Moghu Research Center Ltd., the Experimental Use Permit (EUP) under Section 5 of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended (86 Stat. 983), is hereby issued for the named pesticide. Shipment and/or use under this permit is subject to the provisions of 40 CFR Part 172.

PRIOR TO SHIPMENT AND/OR USE OF THIS MATERIAL, YOU MUST CONSULT WITH THE STATE PESTICIDE REGULATORY OFFICIALS OF THE STATES IN WHICH YOUR EXPERIMENTAL PROGRAM WILL BE CONDUCTED AND OBTAIN A STATE PERMIT OR LICENSE IF SUCH IS REQUIRED. ISSUANCE OF THIS FEDERAL PERMIT DOES NOT NEGATE THE NEED FOR PERMISSION FROM INDIVIDUAL STATES. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN REVOCATION OR MODIFICATION OF THIS EXPERIMENTAL USE PERMIT.

Prior to initiation of this experimental program in any State, you must notify the State lead agency of the State in which your experimental program will be conducted of the specific testing program (when, where, how much, etc.).

Based on the experimental program submitted, this product may be shipped for use under this permit to Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Georgia, Idaho, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

This permit is being issued on the condition that the registrant ensure that the following are adhered to:

1. Product must not be used on golf courses that utilize tile drains.
2. No more than 6 acres per golf course may be treated per year.
3. Product must not be applied within 100 feet of any water body.
4. Applications must only be made via hand sprayers or riding sprayers equipped with low-drift nozzles (eg. air-induction nozzles).

All information required under the regulations for registration will be required prior to registration or establishing permanent tolerances. Refer to the Code of Federal Regulations, Vol. 40, Part 158.


The labeling submitted in connection with the application for an EUP is acceptable and a stamped copy is enclosed for your records. The labeling must be used for all shipments under the EUP.

Quarterly reports required under section 172.8(b) of the Code of Federal Regulations are waived for this
